Apart from delivering our **SNOOP** services we work with parents and carers to provide practical support and look for solutions while sharing our knowedge and experience with them.

We too have lived experience of caring for a child with SEND and they are now adults. So here are just some of the things we do:

Support for parent/carers to prepare and plan ahead for transition into adulthood when their son or daughter leaves school or college

Provide support for our parent/carers
by attending reviews for EHCP'S,Transition and social care reviews

Attend information events and Transition awareness days around the Bradford District

Be there to listen when life seems a bit too overwhelming.... an open door and friendly face

Currently we are involved in the following:

We have a representative on the Board of the Parents Forum for Bradford & Airedale (PFBA) We work closely with AWARE and PFBA to look at new ways to support more parent/carers together

We have a representative on the following partnerships and Boards;

- Local Authority workstream to improve Preparation for Adulthood;
- Bradford District and Craven Carers Partnership and Carers Provider Forum; Transforming Lives Programme Board (Autism and Learning Disabilities);
- VCS Safeguarding Board

Other parts of my work include:

- Supporting the staff teams with agreeing behaviour strategies for individual young people.
- Delivering the training and co-ordinating the Help I'm Lost Card (Bradford Safe Places Scheme).
- Working with the teams to ensure we maintain our 'Good' Ofsted Award and always finding new ways to improve, engage the children and young people.






Childcare

The Oral Health Team came to visit and held a fluoride clinic at our nursery in October.


We also had our own dental practice set up in our role play area too.
